

KNOW YOUR BYLAWS!

Article III - GENERAL Section A - DUES

Did you know that "The Chapter will establish annually during the month of March the specific amount for dues to be paid during the ensuing year. The period covered by annual dues will be July through June. The amount set by the Chapter will include assessments by the state, regional, and national offices for allocating membership."?

Remember, our Chapter dues are \$100/year for Regular and Associate Members. Current Life Members only pay \$50/year. Those wanting to become Life Members pay a one time fee of \$800 and then \$50/year going forward. We also have a subscribing Life Membership where members pay \$62.50/year plus \$50 for the current membership year..

This entity, provides support to women who have survived the ravages of ovarian, breast, lung, cervical, stomach, and oral cancer. Many are financially stressed, yet they have bonded together to support one another during their pre and post medical crisis. PrayInPink provides comfort items, hygiene products as well as adult coloring books, puzzles, and journals to minimize the mental and physical burden of the womens' health condition.

Miami-Dade alumni, humbly extended themselves and established a registry that enabled chapter members to purchase needed items for the ladies who are experiencing the devastation of cancer. The registry was established via the Amazon Smile platform. This enabled alum to support our beloved FAMU, as a portion of all purchases will be donated to The FAMU Foundation.




